lease, rental, or use of any such premises, house, tenement or building involved shall be unlawful and the city attorney shall take all appropriate steps and institute appropriate proceedings to prevent such lease, rental or use until such discontinuance and such installation or connection shall have been effected. (Code 1936, p. 108, § 4)

Sec. 11-68. Same—Performance by city; collection of cost.

If any owner of any such premises, house, tenement or building shall fail or refuse within the period permitted by this article to make the installation or connection required by this division or by any resolution adopted pursuant hereto, the city, at the expense of such owner, may cause such installation or connection to be made, and the cost thereof shall be a lien on such premises, house, tenement or building and the land upon which same are located, superior to all other liens except for taxes, and the same shall be collected as other debts are collected or liens enforced. In any such case, the mayor shall, immediately after such installations or connections shall have been made, prepare a statement in writing setting forth the name of the owners and a description of the property on or in connection with which such installation or connection shall have been made, together with the cost of making such installation or connection. Such statement shall be signed by the mayor in his official capacity and filed with the probate judge of the county for record in the mortgage records of the county.

ARTICLE IV. LOUD OR EXCESSIVE NOISE*

Sec. 11-70. Loud or excessive noise.

It shall be unlawful and constitute a nuisance for any person to make, create or maintain any unreasonable, loud, disturbing or

excessive noise or noise of such character, intensity or duration which unreasonably interferes with the comfort, health or repose of any individual within the corporate limits of the City of Pell City, Alabama.

Sec. 11-71. Motor vehicles and pedestrians.

No radio, musical instrument or similar device, whether from a motor vehicle or by a pedestrian, shall be operated or played in such a manner as to be plainly audible at a distance of more than five (5) feet from a motor vehicle or more than ten (10) feet from a pedestrian.

Sec. 11-72. Commercial and residential buildings.

No one shall operate or play any radio, television, phonograph, musical instrument or similar device which produces or reproduces sound, whether from a commercial or residential building, in such a manner as to be plainly audible at a distance of more than fifty (50) feet.

Sec. 11-73. Bands and orchestras—Permit required.

(a) Nothing in this article shall be construed to prohibit performances by a band or orchestra inside a hall or building nor any outdoor performance by such band or orchestra. Provided, however, that it shall be unlawful for any band or orchestra to perform unless a permit therefor has been secured from the police chief.

(b) To secure a permit, written application shall be made to the police chief at least five (5) days prior to the event. The police chief shall grant a written permit unless in his/her judgment the public welfare, peace and health require that it be refused. (Ord. No. 2003-1678, § 4, 6-9-03)
