The City Council of the City of Pell City met in a regularly scheduled work session at City Hall at 5:00 p.m. on Monday, October 24, 2022. Present were Council President Alverson, Councilmembers Jay Jenkins, Ivi McDaniel, Blaine Henderson, and Jason Mitcham. Those present constituting the entirety of the Council, Council President Alverson opened the meeting for discussion.

The invocation was led by Reverend Donald Gover.

The pledge to the American Flag was led by Councilmember Blaine Henderson.

The City Clerk had roll call for attendance.

There were no comments regarding the bills on file.

Code Enforcement Official/Fire Marshal Blake Harbison addressed Council regarding the following properties which were set for Public Hearing. Mr. Harbison stated that both properties were still in a nuisance state and in violation of Ordinance 2018-4920.

City Manager Brian Muenger addressed the Council regarding the Board of Education's request to vacate a portion of 2nd Avenue North. Mr. Muenger advised there were meetings held with the Board of Education and the Engineers regarding the request. He confirmed the request would still need a recommendation from the Planning Commission which was likely to be received at the next meeting. Mr. Muenger advised that the Council is tasked with setting the Public Hearing at least 30 days in advance and recommended setting the Public Hearing for

December 12, 2022.

City Manager Brian Muenger addressed the Council regarding a user agreement for the use of Lakeside Park by the Crappie Expo 2023. He stated the dates had been passed through the Park and Recreation Department and confirmed the only request was to use the boat launch at no charge.

City Manager Brian Muenger addressed the Council regarding funds received from St. Clair County Commission for Tourism/Development Funding for the Museum of Pell City and Pell City Chamber of Commerce. Mr. Muenger advised these were funds that the St. Clair County Commission had budgeted for the events. He confirmed the funds would be passed through and disbursed in the appropriate amounts to the appropriate parties.

City Manager Brian Muenger addressed the Council regarding an appropriation request received from the Heart of Pell City. Mr. Muenger advised the request was for approximately \$1,700 for the Annual Christmas Tree Lighting Ceremony. He confirmed the Council had used their discretionary funds the previous Fiscal Year in the amount of \$2,000 for the appropriation.

James Hadaway, Utility Superintendent addressed the Council regarding an upgrade to the Security Camera System at the Waste Water Treatment Plant. Mr. Hadaway advised the current

system was web-based and stated that only one camera works appropriately. Mr. Muenger confirmed the system is approximately eight years old. Mr. Hadaway stated the requested system would operate with fiber and confirmed that it would provide approximately thirty (30) days of data. He also advised the cameras would be purchased off the state bid list.

City Manager Brian Muenger addressed the Council regarding a personnel request for the Utility Department. He advised that the department had attempted to recruit qualified individuals and bring on employees that can contribute immediately. Mr. Hadaway advised that it was hard to recruit qualified individuals because of the competitiveness of the salary in the particular field. Mr. Muenger advised there were two vacancies that needed to be filled. Mr. Hadaway stated they would like permission to bring in Grade III and Grade IV level employees up to step 9 for candidates meeting all requirements of the position without Council approval.

City Manager Brian Muenger addressed the Council regarding a probationary period modification for health insurance. He advised that at some point in the past a 30-day wait period was applicable to new hires. Mr. Muenger confirmed there were a limited number of new hires and stated it was only one extra month of cost of coverage to the City.
